

EP 70: Can lucky charms help you get pregnant?!

This is the Fertile Mindset Podcast, where we explore all the emotional aspects of fertility to support you on your path to parenthood. My name is Sarah Holland. Now let's begin today's episode.

Hello and welcome back to the Fertile Mindset Podcast. It's lovely to have you hear for another chat about all things fertility, mindset and emotions. So, on to today's podcast which was inspired by a recent talk I went to at the Mind Body Spirit festival in London, where Dr David Hamilton was speaking about the topics in his new book Why Woo Woo Works. Now David comes from an interesting place when he talks about the mind-body link and how powerful our minds are in relation to our body and our health, because he started his working life as an organic chemist for a major pharmaceutical company developing heart and cancer drugs and working on drug trials and research. What got his attention in the drug trials was how powerful the placebo effect was in the control groups. The control groups in research studies to test drugs are given a dummy drug, often just a sugar pill believing that they could be receiving the new medication that was being trialled. And although they had received no medication at all, he noticed that the improvements in health in the control groups were often significant which led him to look further into what is happening when someone believes they are receiving a drug, and how does the body then react to that belief and create healing.

If this fascinates you too, I highly recommend reading any and all of David Hamilton's books. They are all phenomenal and contain a huge amount of research to back up his theories, showing the power of the mind-body and how we can harness this for our own health and wellbeing.

His latest book which he spoke at the event is called Why Woo-Woo Works and this focused specifically on how and why therapies such as Reiki and Crystal therapy do in fact work and how it's proven by science.

When he spoke to us about the power of using crystals in his talk, he invited us take a small crystal from the stage and then return with it to our seats as he guided us through how to sit with the crystal, turning it over in our hands, with eyes closed, programming it to help us with a goal we have in our life. By focusing on the goal while holding the crystal it is programmed through the science of association. So that every time we pick up that crystal in the future we are once again connected to the goal, it is brought to mind, and the more we feel a real connection to a goal the more likely we are to achieve it.

Now this got me thinking about my own fertility journey, and different things I did throughout my time of trying for a baby because I believed or hoped that they would bring me luck. I know I approached some of it tongue in cheek and with an attitude of "I'll try anything if it will help me get pregnant" but I did also feel this connection, the science of association too.

There were many things I did to bring me luck and I'll share some of them with you now so you can have a laugh at my expense! But there was one, that I'll save until last that I feel gave me a real strong connection to success and that I felt so strongly that I wasn't willing to part with this connection until exactly the right time.

Ok so first, some fun and silly ones. The first one was actually on the day that we decided to try for a baby, before we knew that we would have fertility problems. On that day we were on holiday, and we did two things. We went to a store called Mothercare, which sells everything for babies, and bought a tiny little soft dog that we named Lucky, to be our mascot on this journey to parenthood. We also went for tea at the best place to have tea in the whole of the UK I'm sure, Betty's tearooms in Harrogate, and I ordered their Good Luck green tea. It felt like the perfect and most obvious choice, and little did we know that we would need luck at that point. But later I felt like I must have known that it would be difficult for us and having those good luck talismans – including the tea label with its name on that I still have to this day – it felt like they helped us start our journey on the right footing, if that makes sense. It just felt right.

Then later on, when we'd already been trying to conceive unsuccessfully for some time, we had a holiday to St Emilion, the beautiful town in France. We went on a tour of their underground caves and the guide showed us this seat carved into the stone that was believed to be a fertility seat, and if a woman was struggling to conceive, she should sit on the seat and of course her wish to have a baby would come true. Well, my husband and I glanced at each other, waited for the tour to move on, and then I jumped onto that seat to absorb all of its magical powers! Did I get pregnant soon after? No, I didn't, but we did take another trip a while later to Bosnia, where we stayed in the capital Sarajevo and went on a walking tour. Our guide took us to a small church where there was a tomb for a baby who had died hundreds of years ago, and it had become something of a legend that if a couple were to walk around the tomb, then lay under it and sleep there they would conceive a baby of their own. The problem was that this needed to happen I think for 40 days in a row, which wasn't going to be possible, but we did spend just a little bit of extra time with that tomb of miracles during the tour!

And another time, closer to home at a summer fair there was a display by the local Morris Men. If you're not from the UK, you may not have heard of Morris Men or just The Morris. They are traditional folk dancers who dance with sticks and bells and are generally a lot of fun to watch. And I didn't know about their pagan links to fertility before that day though, until after they stopped dancing, they announced they had baked fertility cake and would anyone like a slice. As the plate was passed around, I ran to the other side of the arena to make sure I got my piece of fertility cake, arms waving saying "me me me!" I had been trying for a

baby for quite some time by then and was no longer shy about grabbing any opportunity, however bizarre, that may improve my fertility.

As I think of these memories now, they do make me smile, and they made me smile at the time too. They brought a sense of fun and lightness into what was a really tough and challenging time. They also kept our focus on having a baby and recommitting to it again and again in a fun and playful way. Did any one of those things help me get pregnant? Not directly at the time, but I do believe they helped me stay connected to my goal, my dream, and acted as little nods to my dream – telling me I was heading in the right direction.

Now, there was one other that I'd like to tell you about because this was a much longer commitment to something that acted as a lucky fertility charm for me.

I have a friend who at the time was one of the most fertile people I know. She had 3 small children quite close in age, so she was often pregnant when I first knew her! She knew of our struggles to have a baby and was one of my most supportive friends, often checking in with me, sending me flowers when I had a pregnancy loss, and generally understanding the right things to say and do. She's from New Zealand and one day she offered to lend me her Māori fertility pendant made of green stone. She told me that she had worn it before she conceived, as had some of her friends, and now she wanted me to have it to help me. Now there was a lot of history there, a lot of success and it was only being passed on to me when a mutual friend of ours who'd had fertility issues too, had got to her 12 week scan and felt comfortable to pass it on to me. So I received this with deep gratitude and a kind of reverence around the power of this pendant, and I wore it every single day for the remaining few months of trying to conceive, then through my positive pregnancy test on Christmas Day 2006, through all the early scans I had, and once I got to my own 12 week scan I gratefully and happily passed it on to the next friend who was in need of some fertility magic.

Now, do I believe this pendant had special powers? It is true that everyone who wore it became pregnant, even if they had fertility issues. And this fact made me commit 100% to wearing it myself. Something that helped me through my time of trying to conceive my first baby, was a constant and unwavering belief that someday somehow, I would become a mother, I would have a baby. And wearing the pendant, and all the other things I did, helped to affirm that belief and make it stronger.

Belief alone? – is that enough to overcome fertility issues? What if there's a real medical problem? Something that needs treatment to make pregnancy possible? Well, this is where we come to the powerful combination of our mind, our thoughts, our beliefs and the impact they can have on our body and our health, but also the clarity that comes with a strong and calm mind. A clarity that identifies when we need to reach out for medical support. Whether that's for testing, for diagnosis, or for treatment, and we can then take those steps and make decisions about fertility treatment from a very clear and informed place. It's the combination of our own innate power to heal and to know what we need, alongside the medical science that can bring amazing results for so many. Which is why having lucky charms, pendants, rituals or whatever will always have a special place for me. If nothing else, they are a constant reminder of what I truly want in my life, and they bring me back to myself, to my own plans and dreams, and belief that somehow this is possible.

And as I've been talking to you about this and remembering the pendant I wore through the last part of my fertility journey and into pregnancy, I was also thinking about the members in the Fertile Mindset Sanctuary because when a new member joins us, we send them a little gift in the post. It's a special Sanctuary wristband with a message of support, and when we meet on Zoom and I see our members, often they're wearing their wristband. They feel connected to our support by wearing it and having this constant reminder with them at all times. I've been told that the wristband has accompanied them to fertility appointments and through their treatment procedures, or that they just wear it every single day, like I did with the pendant.
