Nat Kringoudis: Especially for women who have been in it for a long time to rediscover and trust their body and really believe that they can fall pregnant and will fall pregnant. So, I do, I spend a lot of time. Sitting with patients nowadays. I think once upon a time, I spent a lot of time physically addressing the issues that we were seeing, whether it was endometriosis or PCOS or unexplained infertility or just even just hormone imbalances in general. And I loved that. But I did realize that there was this big piece that was missing and that was that women were basing their fertility on other people experiences, not their own facts. We borrow other people's facts, so to speak, and take them on as our own.

Maria Rothenburger: Trusting yourself, it's very difficult to do so after you've been through everything through trauma, after trauma in the fertility world, it's really hard to trust that your body is sending you the right signals, um, that your intuition is on point. And so I help guide through that when we are in a session. Um, I make sure that that's in the forefront and we talk about tapping into what, how that feels. What, what does that feel like to you to hear that right now?

Kate Codrington: We still feel that massive need, that longing and really speaking to the longing for a child. And that will move into your autumn, that longing. Alongside the need for space. Alongside the need for quiet, for truth, and this is a really, a massive challenge

because you are holding two conflicting needs together. Both the need, the summery need for expression, and the autumn need for time alone and true values and feeling. All the emotion that goes along with the healing process.

Emily Ginn: Infertility in general is a difficult, challenging, often, times traumatic experience. What was making it more difficult was how I was thinking about myself and the experience. And so when I kind of was able to step away from that and zoom out It really was like this epiphany for me, like, Oh my goodness, I, I can offer this to other women. That there's a different way to experience infertility without being so, without being caught so much in self-loathing, without the self-criticism, without the added suffering that we throw on top of an already difficult time.

Nicola Duffell: We don't often give ourselves permission to feel permission, to feel the grief, permission to feel the anger. You said it earlier like they're perceived negative emotions and we don't give ourselves permission to feel, let alone dare to ask for support or voice it to those we love. And sometimes I think even just that permission to feel is such a gift, you know, in what you do because you know, most of the time we are surrounded by very well-meaning loved ones, but they don't know how to even hold how they feel, let alone to hold how you feel. And sometimes you just need a space where you are allowed to feel. Where you are allowed to voice everything, all the thoughts that we judge as wrong or negative, to voice, all those things,

Emma Roberts: It's shocking. It's emotionally gruelling. Sex takes on a completely different kind of sense, it becomes a chore. I have to do this now. Or with fertility treatment, you know, such as IVF and that's not meant to have sex even, So relationships suffer. I mean it's, it's huge actually, I think. And, and if you can kind of get a handle to help yourself and, and. You know, I'm talking if this is just the woman, but actually men too, in any form of relationship, you know, straight, gay, bi binary, non-binary, whatever it is, it doesn't matter. It's about empowering yourself on that path because anybody who wants a baby and wants to create a family should be given as many opportunities as possible to do that in whatever way and getting to that place can be a stressful journey too.

Kristin Cornett: Yeah and getting really interested in the connection between the mind and the body, understanding that those things aren't separate. I think that's, that's such a mistake and that we have committed in medicine, you know, and conventional medicine especially. But that's trickled down into, you know, the functional and holistic side as well. This idea of the separateness of the mind and the body, but truly, I mean the mind, what we think, what we experience, the emotions that we feel that directs our nervous system to direct the rest of our body systems to behave in a certain way. And if we're constantly sensing threats or we're constantly feeling that sense of like hypervigilance, or our bodies are experiencing that on a physiological level, we're not going to function optimally.

Jen Edmonds: All of our systems are going to be affected. And often the result of that happens to be trouble conceiving.

Something like tapping really brings you to a good baseline, and then yoga really takes it for me from there. You know, I find that once I'm at that lovely baseline, okay, now I'm in a state where I can listen to my body a little bit. Okay. How fast is my heart beating? How quickly am I breathing? And then starting to move your body is one of the very best ways to get you out of, you know, your thoughts and your emotions and that fight or flight. And it starts to tell your brain, Okay, we're safe. You know, we're in a position now where there's nothing to worry about.

Well, wasn't that amazing to hear those voices speaking such powerful words, such truth and understanding for you and everyone on a fertility journey.
